Food for Thought

Reading together as a family is an excellent way to help children of all ages develop strong language skills, share experiences and learn about their world. Young children may want to hear the same story read over and over again, while older children and teens may take an interest in a particular topic and want to read many different books about the same subject. When you read a picture book to your child, read the page before showing him the picture. Allow her time to imagine what the picture will be. As he begins reading on his own, he may make pictures in his head of what he is reading. If the story takes place in another city or state or country, show your child a map and talk about where the place is, how far it is from Houston, what language they speak and something interesting about the culture. Bilingual books are a fun way for families who speak two languages to share the same story. Bilingual books are available in English/Spanish and many other languages.

Some of my favorite November and December books include Sarah Morton's Day: A Day in the Life of a Pilgrim Girl and Samuel Eaton's Day: A day in the Life of a Pilgrim Boy, both by Kate Waters (Scholastic Bookshelf Series), Too Many Tamales by Gary Soto and Ed Martinez, The First Tortilla, a bilingual book by Rudolfo Anaya. Where Fireflies Dance, Ahi, donde bailan las luciernagas, by Lucha Corpi, is an inspiring tale of a young girl who finds her destiny with the help of her family.
